As well as holding 2 World Records (“The shortest time taken to reach the three extreme points of the Earth: Mt Everest, the North Pole and the South Pole”, and “The longest Arctic unsupported snow-kiting expedition”), Adrian is an accomplished figure in many other walks of life. He is an author, keynote speaker, leadership and team consultant, documentary presenter, social commenter, and campaigner.

During the talk, 200 F.1 to F.5 students listened attentively to Adrian speak on climate change and sustainability. His enthusiasm for what he does makes him a highly engaging speaker!.

Students were then offered the opportunity to ask Adrian some questions about his experiences. All of the questions proposed to Adrian were intelligent, mature, and well-constructed. Students should take pride in the impressive manner in which they represented themselves and the school.
