Mr. Chan Ho-yuen Daniel, MH, was enrolled in our school in 1997 and elected as a Hong Kong Outstanding Young Person in 2019. He served as an alumni director of our school from 2021 to 2023. He is the first wheelchair badminton player in Hong Kong, ranking second in the world. He has won a silver medal at the 2019 World Championships and the 2018 Asian Para Games. Moreover, he secured a bronze medal in wheelchair badminton at the 2020 Tokyo Paralympics. He will compete in the Paris Paralympics this September, with a chance to vie for the gold medal.

At the age of 23, Chan Ho-yuen was involved in a traffic accident that led to amputation to save his life. Despite facing countless challenges, neither did he feel discouraged nor disheartened. Instead, his resilience and determination motivated him to reach the Olympic stage. His passion towards badminton, as well as his positive attitude truly inspire all of us.

Alumnus Chan will compete in the "Men's WH2 Singles" category at the Paralympics, with matches taking place in Hong Kong on the evening of September 2. Let's encourage and support our alumnus!
